SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

"HOLY HUMOR SUNDAY"

April 24, 2022

This week we are resurrecting an old Easter custom begun by the Greeks in the early centuries of Christianity: "Holy Humor Sunday" --- a celebration of Jesus' resurrection -- on the Sunday after Easter. For centuries in Eastern Orthodox, Roman Catholic and Protestant countries, the week following Easter Sunday was observed by the faithful as "days of joy and laughter" with parties and picnics to celebrate Jesus' resurrection. Churchgoers and pastors played practical jokes on each other, drenched each other with water, told jokes, sang, and danced. The custom was rooted in the musings of early church theologians that God played a practical joke on the devil by raising Jesus from the dead.

Holy Humor Sunday services not only give Christians an opportunity for ongoing celebrations of the greatest miracle in human history - Jesus' resurrection - it also gives each of us an opportunity to celebrate and give thanks for our own smaller resurrections in this world and this life.

He is coming with the clouds; every eye will see him, even those who pierced him; and on his account all the tribes of the earth will wail. So it is to be.
